### **PSAT/NMSQT®** Test Dates

College Board has indicated that districts may decide on a PSAT test date any time during the month of October. Check with your high school counselor to know exactly when your school is testing.

## PSAT/NMSQT® Test

The 11<sup>th</sup> grade PSAT test is the qualifying test for National Merit<sup>®</sup> Scholarship Programs. The test is given on a specific date selected by the high school, usually in October. Typically, a student must score in the top one half of one percent (99.5%) in the student's state of residence to qualify for National Merit<sup>®</sup> Semifinalist. National Merit<sup>®</sup> recognition can provide significant scholarship opportunities for college.

Some schools offer the PSAT test to students in 9<sup>th</sup> grade, and most schools will offer it to 10<sup>th</sup> graders. These serve as practice tests for students and as a test preparation starting point. The test is scored from 320-1520. For students completing high school in four years, only the 11<sup>th</sup> grade test is used to qualify for the National Merit<sup>®</sup> recognition programs. Score reports are released in November.

### SAT<sup>®</sup> Test

The SAT test is used by colleges around the country in the selection process for admission, scholarships, honors programs, and/or competitive majors. The test has two sections: the Reading and Writing section covers reading comprehension and grammar while the Math section covers foundational math concepts. Each section is scored from 200-800. The two section scores are added together for a total score between 400-1600. Score reports are released into your College Board account 2-3 weeks after the test date.

### ACT<sup>®</sup> Test

The ACT test is used by colleges around the country in the selection process for admission, scholarships, honors programs, and/or competitive majors. It is accepted equally to the SAT test by colleges. The digital ACT test, which debuted a new format in April, features three "core" sections—English, Math, and Reading. The Science and Essay sections are optional. The three core sections are scored from 1–36, then averaged for the composite score. The score report will also include a STEM score if students choose to take the Science section. Score reports are released 2-8 weeks after the test date. **Note:** Beginning in September 2025, both the digital and paper versions will feature the new format.

# **TESTING TIMELINE &**

KD Recommendations ()

### 9<sup>™</sup> GRADE

**PSAT test** – October (for practice) Date selected by high school and **not offered by every** school.

### 10<sup>TH</sup> GRADE

**PSAT test** – October (for practice) Date selected by high school and **offered by most** schools.



We recommend students prepare for **both** the SAT and ACT tests during the 10th grade to see if there is an advantage with either test format.

### 11<sup>™</sup> GRADE

PSAT test – October (used for National Merit® recognition)
Date selected by high school and offered by every school.
SAT test – August, September, October, November, December, March, May, June

ACT test – September, October, December, February, April, June, July

We recommend students prepare for and take **both** the SAT and ACT tests during the 11<sup>th</sup> grade if necessary, to see if there is an advantage with either test format. Typically, students should plan to take the SAT test twice during fall/winter and the ACT test twice during the spring/summer. Why? This affords students more time to develop familiarity with the ACT test's more advanced math section.

Our goal for all of our students is to finish testing by the summer before 12<sup>th</sup> grade. **Why?** Finishing allows students to spend the summer before their 12<sup>th</sup> grade year focused on college applications and admissions essays, which can be a very labor-intensive project. **Note:** If you are still testing in 12<sup>th</sup> grade, please see a KD Advisor for a plan that is specific to your admissions goals.

### 12<sup>TH</sup> GRADE

SAT test – August, September, October, November, December, March, May, June

ACT test – September, October, December, February, April, June, July

• Test dates selected must meet college application and scholarship deadlines. December is the last available testing date for most college applications. **However,** many students continue to test into the spring of 12<sup>th</sup> grade year for different reasons: scholarships, competitive degree plans, honors colleges, etc.

**NOTE:** Colleges accept SAT or ACT test scores equally. Colleges may utilize scores submitted from either the highest score on a single test day, or the highest component scores submitted from multiple test dates, often referred to as superscoring. Always check the college testing policies for clarification.



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
