





11th Grade through Graduation KD's most comprehensive college counseling offering guides students and parents through the college application process in small group settings beginning in the 11th grade. The 16 lessons cover topics such as finalizing a college list, writing college essays, paying for college, and more. The program also includes the following: two **one-on-one college counseling sessions**, the **APPLY NOW! Essay Boot Camp**, an **Aptitude Assessment**, and interactive labs for additional feedback.

7th - 12th Grade

Students work with the college counseling team in hourly sessions that are focused on their individual needs or highest priorities. Topics could include planning middle school and high school courses, brainstorming and/or editing essays, building and finalizing an ideal college list, developing a resume, preparing for interviews, and much more.

Single Session Rate: \$450/hour Bundle of 5 Sessions Rate: \$1875 (5 hours at \$375/hour)

Important note for planning purposes: Our typical 12th-grade student requires 15-20 hours of counseling and editing to produce ~8-10 quality college applications. The same student will also spend 10+ hours of their own time per application.

11th and 12th Grade



These small-group sessions are offered multiple times during the summer and fall to help 12th graders get a head start on college admissions essays. During the boot camp (3 days, 2 hours each day), our college counseling team will guide students through the development of a college essay/personal statement, which can be used or adapted for college admissions.

12th Grade

Understanding the College Admissions Process (students and parents)

Families will learn about how the U.S. admissions process works and how colleges evaluate applications.

Exploring Majors and Careers (students, parents optional)

Students will be guided through their assessment results, including how to explore college programs and careers.



Paying for College (students and parents)

Families will learn about the average cost to attend college and how those costs differ by college type. Different types of financial aid will also be discussed.



Researching Colleges (students and parents)

Families will learn how to research colleges and how to narrow down their list of potential schools.



Requesting Letters of Recommendation (students)

Students will learn how colleges use letters of recommendation, how to choose recommenders, and tips for getting a strong letter.

Finalizing Your College List (students and parents)

Families will examine current college choices, including academic programs, likelihood of admission, cost, and other important factors.

Telling Your Story (students)

Students will learn about the importance of clear, engaging writing. We will also brainstorm potential essay topics.

Writing Your Personal Statement (students)

Students will learn how to write an effective and engaging personal statement that can be submitted to colleges.



Students will learn how to approach writing supplemental essays.



Creating a Resume & Activity List (students)

Students will learn about the importance of a detailed and complete college resume, as well as how to format one and use it to create an activity list.



Completing Applications (students)

This session will walk students through completing the Common Application. Examples of other applications will also be provided.



Understanding Housing, Portals, and Other **Details** (students, parents optional)

Students will learn what to expect after submitting applications, including how to track important steps for financial aid, housing, and other college requirements.



Preparing for Interviews (students)

Students will learn about the purpose of interviews and how to prepare. Students will also discuss common interview questions and how to answer effectively.



Completing the FAFSA and CSS Profile (students and parents)

Families will learn about the FAFSA and CSS profile, including how and when to complete the forms, and what information is required.



Comparing Financial Aid Packages (students and parents)

Families will learn how to compare financial aid packages, loan terms, scholarships, and other aid.



Making Your Final Decision (students, parents optional)

Students will learn how to handle the stress of making a final decision by reviewing what they have learned and celebrating their accomplishments.
